CATESOL Announces the English Language Research Award:

This award is intended to encourage a wider range of scholarly work that may not often be represented in traditional scholarly venues. Through this award, CATESOL hopes to share scholarship that highlights exceptional work being done in the field of ESL/TESL focusing on classroom-based research; curricular projects; well-argued bibliographic research regarding theory, research, pedagogy, and/or educational policy; and other types of research projects with clear pedagogical implications.

Award specifics:

- The award will be granted for a piece written by either a sole author or two authors collaborating, and is open to both ESL / TESL instructor(s) and current or former graduate or undergraduate students. Students who have graduated in Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 are eligible.
- The award winner/s will be given the \$500 award from National Geographic Learning to be presented at the CATESOL Annual Conference, taking place virtually this fall. Please note that co-authors will share the \$500 award from National Geographic Learning.
- The winners' projects will be submitted to the *CATESOL Journal* for review, editing, and publication as potential *CATESOL articles*.

Guidelines:

- The contest is open only to members of CATESOL who are current (or recently graduated) students and instructors from colleges or universities in California.
- The articles can be single- or co-authored (two authors maximum).
- The articles should be no more than 25 pages long including references and appendices, following the guidelines below.
- The articles must be unpublished and not submitted for publication elsewhere.
- Preference given to work relevant to students or teachers in California.
- Submission deadline: The article must be received on or before
August 1st, 2021

Submission Process:

Email the following information to the CATESOL College/University Award Coordinators (see below) 1) Email address, 2) Phone number, 3) Institutional affiliation -if you are a student, include advisor or instructor contact information, 4) Title of research project article, 5) Fifty-word biography, and 6) Paper attached as a pdf with the following format: Style & bibliographic references conforming to APA conventions; no reference to the author in the manuscript; Page one with title & 150-word abstract; all figures, charts, tables, appendices, & illustrations included in the document.
